

ANCIENT NEAR EASTERN AND EGYPTIAN STUDIES, MINOR

Program Overview

The core of the Ancient Near Eastern and Egyptian Studies minor is the study of the histories, societies, and languages (including Akkadian and Egyptian hieroglyphs) of the Ancient Near East and Egypt until the end of the ancient world (usually taken as the 5th century of the Common Era). The minor uniquely offers exposure to a range of approaches: literary, philological, historical, archaeological, art historical, philosophical, and anthropological.
